REPORT OF THE DEAN - DR. PETERSEN

The Graduate Council met March 25 and continues to review the backlog of program proposals. Dual degree programs and acceptance of degrees from non-regionally accredited domestic universities were also discussed.

General Administration has scheduled a series of disciplinary panel reviews of program proposals this Spring and plans to be caught up by Fall. The disciplinary panel review for the request to plan the joint PhD in social work is scheduled for March 31. The request to plan the PhD in institutional research and assessment should be reviewed in the Fall.

GA has set the following priorities for graduate programs:

Masters: teacher education, nursing, nursing faculty, nursing faculty for community colleges, accounting, STEM disciplines, Professional Science Master's programs, physician's assistants.

Doctoral: dentistry (EUC and UNCCH), medicine (EUC and UNCCH), STEM disciplines, physical therapy, pharmacy, criminal justice, faculty for community college, related BOG approved investments.
