<u>Membership</u>: Voting Members of the General Faculty elected from the electoral divisions—six (6) from the College of Arts and Sciences, and one (1) from each of the other electoral divisions—plus one (1) Senator appointed by the Chair of the Senate. Non-voting members may be appointed by the Provost as requested by the Committee.
