Membership: Voting Members of the General Faculty elected from the electoral divisions—six (6) from the College of Arts and Sciences, and one (1) from each of the other electoral divisions--plus one (1) Senator appointed by the Chair of the Senate. Non-voting members may be appointed by the Provost as requested by the Committee.

- Non-voting student member
Currently, students are members or non-voting members of several Senate committees. They have requested to have more of those representations. The Executive Committee and the Senate have decided to reject the idea of having student members of the Faculty Senate or its committees have voting rights. But they did agree to consider expanding the number of ex-officio, non-voting student members on several additional Faculty Senate committees.
